Merit-Based Scholarship:

Merit-based Scholarships are awarded primarily on the basis of academic achievement at the time of entry to the University. When awarding scholarships, in addition to academic achievement, JCU considers information provided during the Admissions process such as: personal statement, letters of recommendation, SAT scores, IB scores, AP tests, A-levels, and extracurricular achievements. The maximum award amount per student is up to \$9,500 or €7.000 annually. Presidential Scholarships are initially awarded for one entire academic year. They are renewed annually provided that you maintain a 3.0 cumulative GPA and satisfactory academic progress at the end of each scholarship year.
