- **visit** a few Italian high schools (with other volunteers), in-person or remotely
- **lead discussions** (in English) about the book (You'll get some training).
- **help** Italian high school students
 - o create 3-min. videos for the **Video Contest** (Fall volunteers)
 - o conduct interviews and write about them in a digital newsletter

Give about 6-10 hours to the program...and gain unique experience.

By volunteering, you:

- become more integrated into the Italian community
- consider your own country and its history from within an international context
- experience how foreigners interpret American culture
- meet Italians and form friendships that might follow you through your life's travels
