Program Description

The joint degree program in Communications between John Cabot University (JCU) and the *Università degli studi di Milano* (Unimi) allows students to concurrently earn a Bachelor of Arts in Communications from JCU and an Italian *Laurea triennale in Comunicazione e Società* from the *Facoltà di Scienze Politiche* Unimi. Students selected to participate in the three year program will do coursework at both universities following a prescribed program of study. The first year of the program will be in Rome. The next 3 semesters will be in Milan, and the final semester in Rome. The language of instruction at JCU is English; at Unimi the language of instruction is Italian. Upon completion of the program students should be able to work fluently in both languages. The suggested program curriculum is as follows:

The following program is for JCU students who enter with the *maturità* and place into English Composition I. Other students will have course schedules that may vary from this basic framework and will be advised accordingly. Course schedules may also vary based upon JCU and Unimi course scheduling. Students will be advised as to their program of study.

Entry into the Program

Entry into the program is limited to 6 currently enrolled JCU students. Students may apply to the JCU-Unimi program during the second semester of their sophomore year. Applications are available from JCU Dean's Office and should be returned by March 1st. Students must submit a certified copy of their *diploma di maturità* or a legally recognized equivalent for non-Italian citizens, curriculum vita, and a 500 word essay regarding why they would like to participate in the program. Students must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of "B" or 3.00/4.00 and be proficient in Italian.

Selection

Students are selected by the JCU Department of Political and Social Sciences and the Office of the Dean of Academic Affairs. Admission will be based on:

- Academic achievement (50%)
- Motivation to participate in the program (10%)
- Knowledge of Italian (30%)
- Curriculum vita (10%)

An Admissions Committee will interview each student as part of the selection process. Students will be notified by March 31st.

Housing and Student Services

Students in the program are responsible for their own housing though each university has housing offices to facilitate finding comfortable accommodations for foreign students - see [Milan Housing](#). Students have access to all student services afforded by each university when studying at each respective university.

Application, Tuition, and Registration

Students must fill out the Unimi application available on JCU's website with the following additions:

- On page 1 at the bottom students should write: "Laurea Triennale in Comunicazione e Società – (Agreement con la John Cabot University)"
- On page 2 the first frame: "Allega" – students need to only attach the copy of the maturità and do NOT need to fill out the other items "Translation/Declaration". Students should ignore the second frame and put in its place a certificate of their enrollment at JCU (available from the JCU Registrar) and a transcript of their courses/grades.
