**What is Italy Reads?** Italy Reads is John Cabot University's cultural and English language exchange program that began in 2009 with a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts for a Big Read – a community reading program. Now in our 6<sup>th</sup> year, Italy Reads thrives on the solid foundation of cultural exchange that has been developed over the years. With Harper Lee's *To Kill a Mockingbird*, Thornton Wilder's *Our Town*, Carson McCullers' *The Heart Is a Lonely Hunter*, F. Scott Fitzgerald's *The Great Gatsby* and Jhumpa Lahiri's *The Namesake* we have discussed (in English) issues related to these classics that have engaged hundreds of people! JCU works with over 40 Italian public high schools in Rome and the nearby community.

**This year we are reading Ernest Hemingway's 'A Farewell to Arms'.**

**What does an Italy Reads volunteer do?** Visit Italian high schools (with other volunteers) to discuss the book and interact with these students of English language and literature. Volunteers help Italian students create short videos for the Italy Reads [Video Contest](#) (click [here](#) to view them) and provide logistical support for the English Theatre of Rome's adaption of the novel. We won't ask much from you (about 6 hours for the semester!) but welcome any more time you would like to give us.

By volunteering, you'll:

- become more integrated into the Italian community,
- have the opportunity to consider your own country and its history from within an international context,
- experience how foreigners interpret American culture, and
- meet Italians and form friendships that we hope will follow you through your life's travels.

All volunteers receive a certificate of recognition from John Cabot University to include on their international resumes.

**How do I sign up?** Go to our website: [www.johncabot.edu](http://www.johncabot.edu) and follow [About JCU/Italy Reads/Volunteer for Italy Reads](#) and register. Read the novel during the summer, take the short on-line training course (required!), and upon completion you're ready to volunteer. When you arrive in Rome, JCU will host an orientation reception for you and all of the other Italy Read volunteers and guide you from there.
