**CARME COLOMINA** is a journalist and an Associate Researcher on European Affairs at CIDOB, Barcelona Centre for International Affairs. She is a weekly contributor in ARA newspaper analyzing International Affairs and visiting professor at the College of Europe in Bruges, Belgium. She also teaches International Journalism at Universitat Pompeu Fabra and Universitat de Vic. She graduated in Information Science from the Autonomous University of Barcelona and postgraduate in European Union Studies from the UOC. She was correspondent of Catalunya Ràdio in Brussels and during her journalist life she has covered international summits and conflicts in some 20 countries.

**TOMAS JERMALAVICIUS** holds a BA in political science from the University of Vilnius, an MA in war studies from King's College London and an MBA degree from the University of Liverpool. Prior to joining the International Centre for Defence and Security (ICDS), he worked at the Baltic Defence College (BALTDEFCOL), first as deputy director of the College's Institute of Defence Studies in 2001-2004, and later as dean of the college in 2005-2008. In the latter capacity, he was also the editor of the journal 'Baltic Security and Defence Review'. He was also involved in the Prometheus Programme of Transition Studies at the Euro-College of the University of Tartu, post-graduate military diplomacy programme at the Lithuanian Military Academy as well as in various projects of the Estonian Academy of Young Scientists (ENTA).

**TANIA BOZANINOU** studied Economics at the University of Athens and received an MA in Journalism from City University in London. She started journalism working for a radio station and an English-language newspaper in Athens. For the last 18 years she worked for 'To Vima', the biggest newspaper in Greece. Parallel to 'To Vima', she worked for some time for a TV news programme for the state TV broadcaster, ERT and also for several magazines. Apart from Greek, she speaks English, French, Spanish, Italian and Portuguese. 'To Vima' is a political newspaper of the centre-left (the equivalent of 'La Repubblica' in Italy). It is being published since 1922. For 'To Vima', she has been covering foreign and home news, from Greece's foreign policy and European affairs to the Middle East and immigrants.

**MARK SHEPHARD** is Senior Lecturer in politics at the Department of Government, University of Strathclyde and was principal investigator on the ESRC/AQMeN Future of the United Kingdom and Scotland research project focusing on the impact of social media on the Scottish Independence referendum. He researches Scottish and British politics, social media, elite behaviour, legislatures, public opinion, parties and elections. His works have been published in a number of journals including Electoral Studies, Political Studies, The Journal of Legislative Studies, The Journal of Elections, Public Opinion and Parties, British Politics, Parliamentary Affairs, and the British Journal of Politics and International Relations.
