

## Italian Placement Test FAQ

### 1. Who should take the Italian placement test?

**I took 2 semesters of Italian a year ago. Should I take the placement test?**

Students who have never studied Italian and don't speak the language should take Introductory Italian I - IT 101, and **do not need to take a placement test.**

Students wishing to take **any** other courses who:

- took Italian for one semester or more
- took Italian more than one semester ago
- learned Italian through family/friends
- studied Italian in high school
- lives in Italy but never studied Italian
- speak the language but don't know how to write

SHOULD TAKE THE ITALIAN PLACEMENT TEST.

### 2. When can I take the test?

The test is available online year-round. For the most accurate placement recommendation, take it just before the semester you actually plan to study the language.

### 3. How do I sign up for the test?
