

## **APPLYING FOR A TESSERA SANITARIA**

### **The first step will be that of obtaining a Codice Fiscale.**

Students must make an appointment at the Agenzia delle Entrate here: <https://prenotazioneweb.agenziaentrate.gov.it/PrenotazioneWeb/prenotazione.action>. They must then go to that appointment with their passport, permesso di soggiorno documents, and housing contract to apply. Students can write to [health@johncabot.edu](mailto:health@johncabot.edu) to ask for assistance in making an online appointment.

Alternatively, students can email Vittorio Careri at [info@italy4you.org](mailto:info@italy4you.org). This external service acts as an intermediary for students, at a cost of €50, payable by credit card, to apply for and receive a codice fiscale in Italy. Italy4you guarantees the issuance of the codice fiscale in 3 business days. Please identify yourself as a JCU student when writing to Italy4you.

### **The second step will be to apply for a Tessera Sanitaria:**

Enrollment in the Italian National Health Service (SSN) for foreign students first requires payment of a fee (the fee is € 149.77 per calendar year, January 1 to December 31). The registration fee is paid at the Post Office by postal order (Bollettino bianco) in the name of: "PT Administration - National Health Service contribution", C / C number 370007 ", inserting the reason "Iscrizione volontaria al Servizio Sanitario Nazionale" (*Voluntary registration in the National Health Service*).

Once the payment has been made, the student can register with the nearest ASL (based on their domicilio/residence) by presenting the following documents (both the original and a copy of each):

- Residence certificate (or self-certification of residence in Rome. This **may** also include a housing contract (see self-certification forms for Residenza OR for Domicilio below)
- Valid identity card / passport
- Fiscal Code (*Codice Fiscale*)
- University enrollment certificate (this can be a letter of enrollment from JCU)

The student then needs to take all these documents to their local ASL and fill out this form: [53\\_34\\_MODULO\\_DELEGA\\_PER\\_OPERAZIONI\\_SU\\_TESSERA\\_SANITARIA.pdf \(aslroma1.it\)](#)

If the student lives in Municipio 1 then they would need to go to the ASL Roma 1 located at Lungotevere della Vittoria, 3, open Monday-Thursday from 8.30-17.15, Friday from 8.30-13.15, and Saturday 8.30-12.15.

If the student lives in a different municipio, they need to verify the ASL specific to their neighborhood.

When at the ASL, the student needs to select their assigned General Practitioner doctor (dottore di base). Once they have selected that medical professional, they will be given a print-out of the tessera sanitaria and the physical card will be mailed to the home address in Rome.
